



## AHC31416 Certificate III in Conservation and Land Management

This course will prepare you for anything the great outdoors can throw at you. You will learn how to maintain natural areas and wetlands, undertake revegetation programs, plant shrubs and trees, identify and treat pests and weeds, and implement workplace health and safety standards and much more. After completing this certificate you will be able to select career paths in conservation earthworks, indigenous land management, parks and wildlife or natural area management.

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## Entry Requirements:

To be eligible to participate in this program, students will be aged between 15—65 years and be in receipt of Newstart, Youth Allowance or Disability payments via Centrelink.

All students identifying as Aboriginal or Culturally and Linguistically Diverse are also encouraged to apply.

If students do not meet any of this criteria, they will need to be referred by a Department of Training and Workforce Development Broker.

## Payment Plan:

Students can enter a fee payment plan over a 10 weeks and have fees deducted directly from their Centrelink payments.
